Under these Articles, delegates were to be appointed annually by the several State Legislatures, and were liable to be recalled at will. No person could be appointed for more than three years in six, nor hold any other office under Government for which he might receive fees or rewards. Delegates were paid by the States they represented, and no State could have less than two nor more than seven delegates, New York sent five, and, on special occasions, a sixth.¹ They were commissioned by the Council of Appointment.
