This large tract of beautiful country included the present townships of Cortlandt, North Salem, Somers and Yorktown, with a part of the town of Lewisboro . Stephanus Van Cortlandt, first Lord of the Manor of Cortlandt, was the son of Olaf Stevense Van Cortlandt, a soldier in the service of the West Indian Company, who left his home at Wyk by Durnstede in Holland, a village not far from Utrecht, and came to this country in 1638 with Wm. Kieft, Director-general of the...
